

Town of Lebanon Split into 2 County Supervisor Districts

As a result of the re-districting after the 2020 Census, some County Supervisor Districts have changed. This happened in the Town of Lebanon. Lebanon is now split into three Wards. All residents of the Town of Lebanon, no matter where you live, will continue to vote at the Lebanon Town Hall.

Lebanon Ward #1 together with the entire Town of Hustisford and the Village of Hustisford now comprise County Supervisor District 17. District 17 is currently served by Supervisor Larry Bischoff. Two candidates for District 17 will appear on the April 5, 2022 ballot.

Lebanon Wards #2 and #3 together with the entire Town of Emmet (Wards #1 and #2) now comprise County Supervisor District 19. Lebanon and Emmet Ward #2 are currently served by Supervisor Allen Behl. Emmet Ward #1 is currently served by Supervisor Jeff Berres. Both Behl and Berres have filed Declarations of Non-candidacy for the upcoming April Election.

There will be a Primary Election on Tuesday, February 15, 2022 in District 19 because three candidates have filed the proper candidacy papers. The field needs to be narrowed to two candidates who will then be on the April 5, 2022 ballot.

The map below shows the new Ward boundaries for the Town of Lebanon. If you live on any of the following roads, you are now in Ward #1 and are part of County Supervisor District 17:
